13 You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and knit me together in my mother's womb. 14 Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex! Your workmanship is marvelous—how well I know it. 15 You watched me as I was being formed in utter seclusion, as I was woven together in the dark of the womb. 16 You saw me before I was born. Every day of my life was recorded in your book. Every moment was laid out before a single day had passed. (Psalm 139:13-16)

There's something about being around someone who knows you so well-Someone who knows your story, your likes and dislikes, your history, your little intricacies. You can be yourself around them, not having to hide anything, because they already know you as you. This psalm reminds us of that deep knowing relationship that God has with us. God knew us before our closest friends knew us, before our parents knew us, and even before we knew ourselves. And God has loved us from the very beginning.



This psalm passage has carried more weight with me recently, as I am becoming acutely aware of what it means for a person to be knit together in their mother's womb. Teddy and I are expecting a new little Bryerwell coming in December; a baby just before Christmas! We are incredibly excited. When I think about this psalm, especially verse 16, I'm struck deeply by what it means that God has known us since before we were born, and just how precious we are to God, that every day of our lives is recorded. When someone comes up for a blessing during communion time. this is what I remind them, and it's my reminder for you today: You are a beloved child of God, and God is with you every single day of your life.


Kristen Haapoja


We are entering our 19th year of partnering with our sister parish in Kipaduka, Tanzania, and it is time for our annual scholarship drive for students who are seeking an education. Our partner parish is deeply appreciative of our many years of financial support! Synodwide in these past 19 years, scholarships have benefitted approximately 1100 students in Tanzania!! We are part of something amazing!

One year of education can cost up to \$600 when it includes room and board for our rural students who live miles away from the nearest schools. With average monthly incomes of less than \$300, parents are able to contribute little to nothing to help pay for schooling for their children.

Our past scholarship fund raising has been very successful thanks to the incredible generosity of our All Saints community. Our fund raising goal is \$5000. More and more children in the village would like the opportunity to attend school, so scholarships are given to as many children as possible. If there are funds remaining after all tuitions are paid, the money is given to the Iringa Diocese to share with students who wish to pursue post-secondary education.

If you can help, truly ANY amount is appreciated. Please be clear in designating the money to "Tanzania Scholarship". You can write a check, contribute through a minimum distribution from your IRA account (Kathy Miller will need to be alerted as to your wishes), or use the "sustained giving" option through our online giving platform. (We lose 5% if you use the "one time giving" option.) If your gift is not clearly labeled, it may be deposited into the wrong account and not find its way to scholarships. Money is due by Oct. 1st.
