Qualities of call committee members: allow the Holy Spirit to guide this congregation through the entire call process.

When identifying candidates for the call committee, it is important to seek persons who:

• will make this work a top priority

- can maintain confidentiality
- · can both listen deeply and also speak up
- act in faith and prayerfulness
- enjoy the trust and respect of the whole membership of the congregation
- can think and decide for the good of the whole congregation rather than their own personal desires or that of any faction or subgroup
- can meet regularly and often
- do not have any personal agendas, grievances, or power issues within the congregation
- are not employed by the congregation or are past pastors of the congregation (or their spouses)
- are not currently serving on the church council (except for the council representative)
- are not from the same family (i.e., spouse or parent/child) as others on the call committee.

FROM THE MISSION AND OUTREACH TEAM

On the Horizon for this Summer

Dear All Saints Community,

We have some outreach activities planned for this summer that will touch many lives. Please keep reading to see what's on the horizon. Perhaps you can help with one or more of these projects. There will be labeled boxes in the Narthex under the coat racks for your donations.

By June 12th:

We are partnering with our Vacation Bible School kids to make tied fleece blankets for Camp Noah. This is a program provided by Lutheran Social Services to support children (ages 6-11) who have lost nearly everything in a traumatic event such as flood or tornado. We would love donations of blanket fleece by June 12 so we have time to prep the fabric for our project day. Fabric details: fleece must be 60" by 72", one side a plain color, the other side a print. They are requesting bright, gender-neutral fabrics. No specifically themed prints such as sports teams, Disney, hunting etc. We recommend such things as animal prints, geometric shapes, plaids, stars, rainbows. Pair that with a solid, color coordinated backing.

In June and July:

The Connect Center (the organization we work with in operating our homeless youth drop-in center) is asking for items to make summer more enjoyable for families and youth. The suggested items include: suntan lotion, band-aids, mosquito repellant, Gatorade and bottled water, granola bars, beef jerky, sunglasses, bandanas, frisbees, balls, sidewalk chalk, bubbles and other "summer essentials" that you can think of.

In July and August:

We recently learned that there is a great need for men's tennis shoes at the Union Gospel Mission in St. Paul. Shoes can be new or gently used. All adult sizes are needed.

Later this summer:

The Mission and Outreach Team will collaborate with the Immigration Task Force to provide backpacks and other necessities for people being deported. More information will be available in a later newsletter.

At any time:

The MORE agency in St. Paul who provides support to refugees and immigrants, is always looking for donations of adult depends. If you know of a family who has leftovers of this product MORE will take them even if it is a partial package. Some organizations will not take personal care products that have been opened.

If you are able to contribute in any way, please accept our heartfelt gratitude! Have a fun and safe summer.
