Hello siblings and saints. As we are entering a new chapter in our life together as a community of faith, I'd like to continue with offering up a book that has helped me over the years. Instead of inviting you to get a copy of it, I'd like to summarize, "Managing Transitions: Making the Most of Change" by William Bridges.

There are three stages to transitions, according to Bridges.

Endings

Transition starts with an ending. This is paradoxical but true. This first phase of transition begins when people identify what they are losing and learn how to manage these losses. They determine what is over and being left behind, and what they will keep. These may include relationships, processes, team members or locations.

Neutral Zone

The second step of transition comes after letting go: the neutral zone. People go through an inbetween time when the old is gone but the new isn't fully operational. It is when the critical psychological realignments and repatternings take place. It is the very core of the transition process. This is the time between the old reality and sense of identity and the new one. People are creating new processes and learning what their new roles will be. They are in flux and may feel confusion and distress. The neutral zone is the seedbed for new beginnings.

New Beginnings

Beginnings involve new understandings, values and attitudes. Beginnings are marked by a release of energy in a new direction – they are an expression of a fresh identity. Well-managed transitions allow people to establish new roles with an understanding of their purpose, the part they play, and how to contribute and participate most effectively. As a result, they feel reoriented and renewed.

We are in a time of transition. Be not afraid. The Holy Spirit will guide, guard, and keep us as we enter our next New Beginning.

UPDATE ON THE STATE OF THE OFFICE OF MINISTER OF WORD AND SACRAMENT:

PROCESS for a different Associate Pastor for the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ at All Saints:

Our beloved Pastor Tanner has taken leave after five years of excellent ministry. Many of you have been asking "What's Next?"

We are entering the liminal zone or Neutral Zone (see PJ's article).

The INTERIM phase has been a half time pastor. Several years ago we had two different interim pastors to help us: James the Elder and James the Younger. Each had a special set of gifts that helped us navigate the call process for the next pastor.

This interim will look different. Pending a meeting with our Executive Committee and the Congregational Council, an announcement will be made during worship and in the June / July newsletter. Know that Pastor Jules will have plenty of support as we enter into the summer programming and worship.

Next, you all will select a call committee by vote in May or June. With the guidance of the St. Paul Area Synod and Bishop Lull, the call committee will begin the process. It is a well designed process. She will walk alongside us during this time of discernment.

The Office of the Pastor is set aside to do the work of Word and Sacrament. Pastors receive a 'call' to a parish. We do not 'hire' them. It is a process that is prayerful, lead by the Holy Spirit, and thoughtful.

The president of the Congregational Council, Julie Smith will be a point person along with Pastor Jules.

This is your church. Pastors are installed into the Office and they are often then 'called' to another congregation or retirement. The language we use around this process is important.



5.Friends in Need

This organization has been one of our community partners for decades! After your enormous outpouring of toiletries, Michelle Rageth (FIN director) sent a letter thanking All Saints for our generous donation of 157 pounds of goods! That's a LOT of paper towels, toilet paper, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, body wash and dish soap. **Well Done!**

By providing these toiletries, it frees up funding for FIN to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables (monthly cost of \$2000-\$3000). Normally, these products would come from Second Harvest but there are supply chain issues. WELL DONE!
