

"An elderly Chinese woman had two large pots, each hung on the ends of a pole which she carried across her neck. One of the pots had a crack in it while the other pot was perfect and always delivered a full portion of water. At the end of the long walks from the stream to the house, the cracked pot arrived only half full.

For a full two years this went on daily, with the woman bringing home only one and a half pots of water. Of course, the perfect pot was proud of its accomplishments.

But the poor cracked pot was ashamed of its own imperfection, and miserable that it could only do half of what it had been made to do.

Inside this edition you will find all sorts of information about All Saints and the events and outreach ministries we are currently engaged in. You'll also be able to see where we are at financially, the overall timeline for the call committee, given to us by the Bishop, and you will get a snapshot of council minutes from our current President Julie Smith.

As we are returning to a more 'normal' time in the church - post covid but not out of the woods yet - we are looking for leaders in the congregation to serve on the church council. Council meets on the second Tuesday of each month. We are also hoping that you will fully participate in the Stewardship for All Season's program by filling out an 'Intent Card' and dedicating it on the second Sunday of November.

Take note that the council has recommended two worship services for Sunday, Christmas Eve. The 9:00a.m. service with be a Family Service; the 9:00p.m. will be a Candlelight Service.

Your Call Committee was voted in to their positions in August. They have met every other week since then to write the Mission Site Profile, create questions, update the Associate Pastor's Job Description, and interviewed two candidates.

The timeline may be moving up depending on the recommendation of the Call Committee. The candidate, if one is chosen, will then be sent to the Council for approval, then to the congregation for a vote.

There was some questions concerning the 'process'. In the ASLC Constitution it states that there are 6 voting members and 2 alternatives. That is the number on this committee.

Here are the members on the Call Committee. These names were provided prior to the vote with a biography on each of the members. Bishop Patricia Lull has met with the Call Committee twice and will be our liaison to the St. Paul Area Synod.

Two names were brought forth from the congregation. Neither are currently available for call. One of the names was Vicar Michael. He is in a different call process and hopes to be ORDAINED at All Saints on December 10th in the afternoon.

We are in a stewardship program that was financially offset by the St. Paul Area Synod. The intention is to share our hopes for the future - as you will read in each of the mailings that will come to your home. If you have not received these mailings, please let us know. If you have any questions, please let us know.

Zion and ASLC property teams met in August and did a full assessment of the health of our campus. We created a 'punch list' of smaller items for each person to repair or build. Zion took on the picnic table, our wasp problems, the sound booth, a candle station repair and other projects.

This expanded team has also be getting bids for the parking lot, solar paneling, snow plowing, and the last phase of our basement lighting retro-restoration using a grant through Xcel. Pierre LePere has been at the helm of this project since the renovation. Maureen Walton also helped assess the feasibility of going solar at All Saints. We received six bids that were scrutinized by a non-profit expert. Should the congregation come into some money for this project or support the Stewardship for all season, we could save 30-40% on the overall project due to the allowances given by the Federal Government. The project could be paid off within four years and allow for over \$40,000 savings projected for energy cost over the next 20 years.

One last note on the solar. The initial cost may be around \$120,000. The rebates could drop it by 40%. If there are eight families that offered \$9,000, they could incorporate and use the gift against taxes. We have GOOD NEWS! Over the summer Mitch (and Penny) Walters took care of the lawn and painted the garage door. This had a huge savings for the church. Please be sure and say thank you.

The Seeds of Faith Garden bore much fruit and veggies this year. Thank you to Leah and to Anna for their devotion to teach little ones how to plant and harvest.

In September, Jim and Shawn Krech spent time cleaning the Resurrection Hall floor, ceiling, rafters, and replacing lights, removing balloons from Ms. Laura's party, and cleaning out the skylights - all with a lift that was rented. Special thanks to Mike, Kristen, and Eva Haapoja for the additional help with those projects.

Share the Joy is a program offered through the local Friends in Need food shelf that provides gifts to children in our community who without this program might not receive gifts at Christmas. I know many of you will be happy to hear they are going back to purchasing gifts this year!


Here is how the program will work at All Saints. Starting in November and continuing into early December, members of the Mission Team will be in the narthex near the Christmas tree to assist you in choosing a child or children for adoption. When choosing a child to adopt, you will get the first name and age of the child and some gift suggestions provided by the child themselves. You purchase the gifts at around \$35 per child, wrap them and bring them back to All Saints on December 10 and the Mission Team takes care of delivering the gifts to the Armory where the families pick up their gifts prior to Christmas.

Cash donations are also accepted, and the Share the Joy team will do the shopping for you! We will also be applying for a Thrivent grant so we can adopt extra children. Share the Joy is about giving of our resources so children in our community can have gifts at Christmas.

This is a wonderful way for families to learn the true spirit of giving. I know of families who make it a special project of choosing a child and then going together to shop to buy the gifts for a child they do not know but knowing the gifts are bought out of love and compassion for our neighbors. I also know that many of us are concerned about what lies ahead with our economy, but I hope that we can also remember that many in our community have needs way beyond our own. Many families have found this to be a fun and rewarding project. The kids really seem to take choosing the child very seriously and enjoy picking out gifts for another child in our community!
