

Introduction

On Ash Wednesday the church began its journey toward baptismal immersion in the death and resurrection of Christ. This year, the Sundays in Lent lead us to focus on five covenants God makes in the Hebrew Scriptures and to use them as lenses through which to view baptism. First Peter connects the way God saved Noah's family

In the flood with the way God saves us through the water of baptism. The baptismal covenant is made with us individually, but the new life we are given in baptism is for the sake of the whole world.

CALL TO WORSHIP

Second Lesson: 1 Peter 3:18-22 from The Message

Baptism and Holy Communion are Pure Gifts from God. We don't earn them, we don't deserve them, and yet God gives them to us as an outward expression of God's incredible GRACE. In this passage we are reminded that we have been washed clean because of the Death and Resurrection of Jesus, not because of something that we have done.

13-18 If with heart and soul you're doing good, do you think you can be stopped? Even if you suffer for it, you're still better off. Don't give the opposition a second thought. Through thick and thin, keep your hearts at attention, in adoration before Christ, your Master. Be ready to speak up and tell anyone who asks why you're living the way you are, and always with the utmost courtesy.

KEEP A CLEAR CONSCIENCE BEFORE GOD SO THAT WHEN PEOPLE THROW MUD AT YOU, NONE OF IT WILL STICK. THEY'LL END UP REALIZING THAT THEY'RE THE ONES WHO NEED A BATH. It'S BETTER TO SUFFER FOR DOING GOOD, IF THAT'S WHAT GOD WANTS, THAN TO BE PUNISHED FOR DOING BAD. THAT'S WHAT CHRIST DID DEFINITIVELY: SUFFERED BECAUSE OF OTHERS' SINS, THE RIGHTEOUS ONE FOR THE UNRIGHTEOUS ONES. HE WENT THROUGH IT ALL—WAS PUT TO DEATH AND THEN MADE ALIVE—TO BRING US TO GOD.

19-22 HE WENT AND PROCLAIMED GOD'S SALVATION TO EARLIER GENERATIONS WHO ENDED UP IN THE PRISON OF JUDGMENT BECAUSE THEY WOULDN'T LISTEN. YOU KNOW, EVEN THOUGH GOD WAITED PATIENTLY ALL THE DAYS THAT NOAH BUILT HIS SHIP, ONLY A FEW WERE SAVED THEN, EIGHT TO BE EXACT—SAVED FROM THE WATER BY THE WATER. THE WATERS OF BAPTISM DO THAT FOR YOU, NOT BY WASHING AWAY DIRT FROM YOUR SKIN BUT BY PRESENTING YOU THROUGH JESUS' RESURRECTION BEFORE GOD WITH A CLEAR CONSCIENCE. JESUS HAS THE LAST WORD ON EVERYTHING AND EVERYONE, FROM ANGELS TO ARMIES. HE'S STANDING RIGHT ALONGSIDE GOD, AND WHAT JESUS SAYS GOES.
